COVID-19 COMMUNITY COLLABORATION FUND

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico (BCBSNM) contributed \$500,000 to the All Together NM Fund and \$250,000 each to the Roadrunner Food Bank and United Way of Central New Mexico.

The Roadrunner Food Bank funding directly supported their response to the COVID-19 pandemic and partially defrayed the costs associated with meeting emerging needs that arose as a result of the pandemic, including one of the largest unexpected costs, a 60% decrease from typical food donation levels and the increased cost of food when purchasing the additional inventory.
